On January 17th the West Tennessee Area honored the Worthy Grand Matron, Mrs. Phyllis Lacki and the Worthy Grand Patron, Mr. Charlie Mixon with a special initiation. This was special because the initiation was exemplified by majority Rainbow Girls. When you say "majority" most people will think of girls that have been out of Rainbow for only a few years. This group of "majority" was ladies that had been out for YEARS! Yes, the initiation was put on by Eastern Star members that at one time had been a Rainbow Girl. These ladies were asked about three months earlier and were given the choice of which station they wanted to serve. Almost all of the ladies jumped at the chance to once again be a Rainbow Girl (a couple really had to be encouraged to participate).

The prompter had little to do that night because the ladies could still remember their parts... some that had not been served in over 50 years. Mrs. Johnnie Mae Bixler, Past Worthy Grand Matron, served as Hope; Mrs. Leslie Elmore, Past Grand Worthy Advisor; Alison Allensworth, Past Grand Worthy Advisor and Mrs. Stephanie Kerlin, Past Grand Worthy Advisor in Arkansas were girls that returned to the ranks and did a great job! There were several of the ladies that had not only been a Rainbow Girl, but also served as a Mother Advisor. We had a Grand Deputy Emeritus, Mrs. Lynda Hunt that had been a Job's Daughter, but had served many years at Savannah's Rainbow.

The Rainbow Girls of Memphis #1, Millington #30 and Bartlett #116 sat on the side line with surprise looks on their faces that the Majority Girls were doing such a great job. Bartlett gained a new member and her grandmother, who served as Drill Leader was so excited to be able to watch another generation become a Rainbow Girl.
